GENERAL SUPERINTENDENTS – *Thomas E. Armiger, Jo Anne Lyon, Jerry G. Pence*

- Ordained and commissioned 145 new ministers and transferred 19 ordained ministers from other denominations
- Conducted 34 District Conferences in conjunction with giving the State of the Church to each District Conference
- Traveled to Latin America, Cambodia, Asia-Pacific Region, Caribbean, India, conducting conferences, preaching, teaching and casting the vision of The Wesleyan Church
- Convened a Doctrinal Symposium on *Human Nature: Perfect, Flawed and Redeemed*
- Convened District Superintendents Institute
- Convened District Superintendent cluster meetings
- Continued dialogue with executive leaders from around 12 like-minded denominations to explore collaborative opportunities for Kingdom ministries
- Convened *The Gathering*

GLOBAL PARTNERS – *H.C. Wilson, General Director*

- Appointed missionaries to Zimbabwe first time in years—anticipating moving of the Spirit similar to Mozambique
- Missionary support & donation income at record level, including largest non-estate gift ever received (\$225,000)
- April 2010-July 2011, 72 mission teams have been or headed to Haiti—more than \$1,000,000 given by our people
- New Nampula District of church in Mozambique went from one convert to 33 churches in five years
- Dropped admin fee to missionaries third year in a row, lowered health insurance premiums by \$4000 per yr per family

- Offered FLAME institutes in nine locations, including Canada
- Launched WesleyanSermons.com, which features a fresh new sermon every week
- Raised the bar on ministerial screening and career-long development through DBMD institute
- Bethany Bible College—new President, Mark Gorveatte, is increasing enrollment
- Houghton College—launched decadal expansion in biology, chemistry, physics; expansion of Paine Science Center
- Indiana Wesleyan University—making health sciences signature ministry, phase one: new health sciences building
- Wesley Seminary at IWU—Seminary has 220 students, 40% of which are Wesleyan
- Oklahoma Wesleyan University—Enrollment highest in history; debt reduced from \$7 million in 2002 to \$1 million now
- Southern Wesleyan University—Dr. Spittal completed 17 years leadership; Media Communication Center completed

SPIRITUAL FORMATION – *James A. Dunn, General Director*

- Led SF Training Events for over 5000 pastors, teachers, leaders for sixth year in a row
- Launched new "Boost for Your Church" event matching veteran ministry coaches with pastors needing next level help
- Launched dynamic Youth Adult Movement for The Wesleyan Church
- Launched "Follow Tour" concept implementing new format and schedule related to Wesleyan Youth Conventions
- Released new curriculum resources for children, youth and adult ministries
- Developing partnerships to offer Spiritual Growth Assessment tools for The Wesleyan Church



EVANGELISM AND CHURCH GROWTH – *Jerry G. Pence, Interim General Director*

- Encouraged prayer, Spirit-empowered obedience, missional passion, holiness evangelism to multiply disciples, leaders and churches in North America's diverse communities and cultures
- Hired Director of Church Health and Multiplication, Tim Roehl, and Director of Hispanic Ministries, Alfredo Barreno
- Launched Million Mile Prayer Walk and SpringLife evangelism emphasis with Local Church Services Division
- Supported urban evangelism thrust with 2011 Easter Offering—*"Taking Grace to New Places"*
- Hosted two Church Planter Assessment Centers and trained directors for regional events
- Provided free church planting resources for interested pastors and church boards
- Deployed four part-time "field staff" for assessing, coaching and training church planters

GENERAL TREASURER – *Kevin J. Batman, General Treasurer*

- Total North American denominational giving \$279 million—down \$4.8 million or 1.7% from prior year
- North American per capita giving (based on total membership) was \$2,003—down \$40 or 1.9% from prior year
- United Stewardship Fund/General collection rate 91.1% in year 2009-10 compared to 91.9% in 2008-09
- Total USF received for General Church support in conference year 2009-10 was \$5.2 million—up .7% from prior year
- Total USF received for Educational Institutions support in conference year 2009-10 was \$6.2 million—up \$53,000

WESLEYAN PUBLISHING HOUSE – *Donald D. Cady, General Publisher*

- *The Invisible: What the Church Can Do to Find and Serve the Least of These* (Arloa Sutter) was named Outreach: Compassion Book of the Year for 2011
- Teamed with Intermedia Publishing Group to create and launch LifeHouse Publishing, offering authors options not previously available through traditional publishing
- Led an initiative with Hispanic denominational church leadership to identify, translate and produce resources for Hispanic church ministry
- Plans to launch an online e-book site for WPH book sales, serving readers utilizing Kindle, iPad, Nook, etc. targeted for late summer

WESLEYAN WOMEN – *Martha J. Blackburn, General Director*

- Ministry changes will be presented at the Summit and possibly move WW from auxiliary to denominational structure
- 13+ anti-trafficking training events were held; 3 Wesleyan universities organized movements to combat trafficking
- Newsletters and current information were translated into Spanish
- Over 700 women attended Wesleyan Women retreats and Women's Institutes for Leadership Development (WILD)

WESLEYAN INVESTMENT FOUNDATION – *Craig A. Dunn, Chief Executive Officer*

- Made 124 new loans to churches last year, bringing total number of current church loans to over 850
- Have more than three times the capital equity percentage that US banking regulators consider to be "well capitalized"
- Have over 6,300 account holders earning interest rates of up to 3%
- Offered the ability to view both savings and loan information online 24/7 and to transfer funds between accounts

WESLEYAN PENSION FUND – *Craig A. Dunn, Chief Executive Officer*

- Provided retirement planning and investment services for over 3,200 members
- Members have over \$120 million collectively invested

COMMUNICATIONS – *Ronald D. Kelly, General Secretary*

- Launched Freesource and Help Center
- Placed *Wesleyan Life* online in its printed format, in addition to the existing, expanded *Wesleyan Life* online
- Expanded social media presence with 7,000+ followers on Facebook and Twitter releases of news stories / devotionals
- Produced all *Discipline* forms in Spanish

STATE OF THE DISTRICT

General Superintendent, Dr. Jerry Pence, delegates to this forty-first annual District Conference and guests; it is my pleasure to bring my 18th annual report to you as District Superintendent of the Indiana Central District of The Wesleyan Church.

Often, I end my annual reports with a challenge. This year, I want to reverse the order.

Recently I read an address by Dr. Timothy Tennent, president of Asbury Theological Seminary, delivered at their fall 2009 Convocation. I was impacted by the introduction. Dr. Tennent said:

"In April of 1739 John Wesley was preaching in an upstairs room in London. About halfway into his sermon the supporting post that held up the floor of the room collapsed under the sheer weight of the number of people who had gathered to hear Wesley. Wesley remarked in his journal that the supporting post fell with a great noise. The floor sank, but it didn't cave in and, to Wesley's own amazement, everyone settled back down and he was able to finish preaching.

What do we do when it seems like the very floor under our feet is giving way? Many of the traditional props and supports which have long given stability to the world of theological education have fallen away with a great crash—what are we to do? How do we live in a time of disequilibrium, uncertainty and change? Never in history has the Church undergone such dramatic growth and change so quickly. When William Carey went to India in 1793, ninety-nine percent of all Christians in the world were white and lived in the Western world. Today, the vast majority of Christians live outside the Western world. We are witnessing multiple centers of Christian vibrancy, even as we see the Western world re-emerging as the world's fastest growing mission field and the home of the most gospel-resistant people groups in the world. In contrast, all of the most gospel-receptive people groups in the world are found in either India or China. We live in an upside-down world.

The floor is creaking beneath our feet."

To illustrate his point, Dr. Tennent gave several convincing proofs:

- *"Christianity Today reported, a few years ago, that 85 percent of the members of Yale University's Campus Crusade for Christ are Asian, whereas, 'the university's Buddhist meditation meetings are almost exclusively attended by whites.'*
- *The historic William Carey Memorial Church in Lester, England, is now a Hindu temple while the church in India, the traditional home of Hinduism, sends out over 41,000 cross-cultural missionaries.*
- *The most representative Christian in 1909 was a 47-year-old British male. The most representative Christian in 2009 was a 24-year-old Nigerian woman."*

What does this mean for the Indiana Central District, for our churches and for you and me? What would Jesus do? We all remember the WWJD bracelets: *What Would Jesus Do?* That is a fitting question by which to measure our actions and attitudes, to be sure.

A more foundational question would be *What did Jesus do?* WDJ? Jesus involved Himself. He came to the world and not just as a tourist. He came not for a visit but to *"seek and save."* Jesus concentrated His attention on the receptive and fertile field. People who were not very important by the world's standards were important to Him. He *"preached the good news to the poor and proclaimed freedom for the prisoner, sight for the blind, release for the oppressed"* (Luke 4:18-19).

What did Jesus do? He gave His life and commanded His followers to continue His mission of reaching and teaching, helping and healing, proclaiming and performing His will.

Another WWJD? *What will Jesus do?* Jesus will help us, inspire us, fill us, use us and bless us.

I read recently, an article by David Felner, editor of *Holiness Today*, official magazine of the Church of the Nazarene. He mentioned the distinction between renewal, revival and awakening.

- *"Renewal happens when God supernaturally touches the heart of a single individual.*
- *Revival happens when God supernaturally touches a community of faith.*
- *Awakening happens when society around us is impacted by God's supernatural touch."*

I'm convinced that renewal is happening to some people in our churches. We sense it in the testimonies they share. God is real in their experience and they are reveling in his mercy and grace.

A few of our churches are experiencing revival at any given time. The corporate experience is one of God's overpowering presence. People who visit such churches are struck with the fact that "something is different here."

But only occasionally do we see the desired results of revival, an awakening in the community. Our churches ought to be making a difference in our communities. I've asked the question before and will again: If your church closed, would anybody notice? Would there be a void? Would you be missed?

I am asking every local board of administration and every pastoral advisory committee to spend some time this coming year discussing and, if possible, implementing some new community ministry. The opportunities are great. It might be an after-school program, a tutoring program or a ministry to special needs individuals. Perhaps your community schools have cut out their music program or art program. What an opportunity for the church to offer something to fill the gap.

The goal, of course, is to reach people for Christ. But a first step is to find a need and fill it. I believe every church could offer some program that enriches their community and opens doors for the gospel.

The increasing ethnic diversity of our field, the Indiana Central District, compels us to reach out beyond ourselves, to others, with the gospel. Many of our churches should identify a culture group in their community and seek to offer ministry to that group. Already some of that is happening. A recent example is Indianapolis Evanston Avenue Wesleyan Church. On Sunday evenings the church hosts a Haitian service. The potential of doubling their number is very real for that church. Many other churches in our district have the same potential if they would identify a culture group, open their building to that group and bring them under the umbrella of the local church.

❖ **Several things of particular note should be mentioned in this report:**

- Rev. John Freed is leading an ambitious church planting effort in Noblesville. Waterline Church is off to a great start. It boasts initial statistics that put it in the top 1 percent of church plants. We expect this church to be a vital part of planting other churches within our district, for the glory of God and the advancement of His Kingdom.
- The Sanctuary Church became an affiliate church on January 10, 2011. This relationship gives us an opportunity to know each other better and share in ministry concerns and resources. Rev. George Martin leads this marvelous inner-city church in downtown Indianapolis. We are pleased to have "The Sanctuary Church" affiliated with our district.
- Kokomo Mt. Zion voted to close on March 27, 2011. We are happy for the impact this church had during its years of existence. The life of a church, like that of a person, has a beginning and an end. Like a person, every church makes its impact and we are thankful for effective ministry and good memories.
- Our first annual Power Rally is now history. At the writing of this report I am praying that it will be both powerful and a rallying point for our district. We will be assessing this event and making adjustments as we move forward. Thanks are extended to the planning committee who worked under the direction of Rev. Eric Roemer to provide the Power Rally for our district.

❖ **In closing, I want to thank some special people:**

- First, I thank my wife, Carol, for the support that she is to me. I'd not be able to accomplish the things I do without her help.
- My office assistant, Debra Levite, is very capable and keeps things running in our district office. She has been especially busy getting ready for our annual district conference and a number of you have expressed your gratitude for her help to you individually.
- The District Executive Committee, consists of the assistant district superintendent, Rev. Paul Boss; district secretary, Dr. Mark Rennaker; district treasurer, Mr. Rod Benson; and member-at-large, Mrs. Martha Blackburn. I lean on them for direction and wisdom.


- The district board of administration has been especially busy this year. Our meetings have been longer and more intense than ever in my experience as a district superintendent. But the district board has risen to the tasks at hand and I thank God for their guidance. Each meeting closed with a sense of accomplishment and peace in the Lord Jesus Christ.
- The other boards and committees of the district will have opportunity to report to you today. I know you'll receive their reports with appreciation for their dedicated service to the Lord and His church.
- A special note of thanks goes to the pastors of our district. We have a gifted group of clergy. Their dedication to the Lord and His Church fuels a passion to serve selflessly and lead courageously. We thank God for them.
- Finally, to the lay people of our district: Your concerted efforts are the most important ingredient in our success as a district. Without you, there would be no local churches, or district or Wesleyan Church. If we were to add up the hours that were involved in church life across our district this past year, the number would be astounding. In any individual church, the hours of planning, volunteering, leading, meeting, etc., would be many. Multiplied by sixty-six churches, one can only imagine the number of hours represented across our district. Thank you for being "The Church."

❖ **Finally, just a few words about our statistics:**

- Year past:
 - ≈ Membership
 - Covenant Membership increased, by 49 or 1.3 percent to 3,793.
 - Community Membership increased, by 123 or 26 percent to 589.
 - Student Membership increased, by 38 or 95 percent to 78.
 - ≈ 879 salvations were reported this year, down 36 (.38%) from last year.
 - ≈ 235 baptisms were reported this year, up 13 (.56%) from last year.
 - ≈ Primary worship attendance increased (including our affiliate church, The Sanctuary Church) by 327 or 5.6 percent to 6193.
 - ≈ Combined Stewardship Fund (60 percent General Fund/40 percent District Fund)
 - Payments were up 1.8 percent for a total of 95.4 percent.
- Year present:
 - ≈ I am hopeful we will see at least a 5% gain in membership and worship attendance this coming year.
 - I will soon be announcing a "Membership Sunday." This will be a Sunday when we promote membership and seek to add to our numbers.
 - ≈ I am praying that we will see a 10 percent gain in salvations recorded and baptisms recorded.
 - ≈ I trust we will see a continued upward trend in our Combined Stewardship Fund.
 - It is important that each church assumes its responsibility to contribute its fair share for the ongoing work of our district and general church.
 - ≈ To be vital, as a district, we must continually reaffirm our commitment to both church health and church planting.

May we know the Lord's blessing as we follow the leading of his Spirit, making us sensitive in our decisions, sagacious in our work and satisfied with the results of full commitment to the cause of Christ.

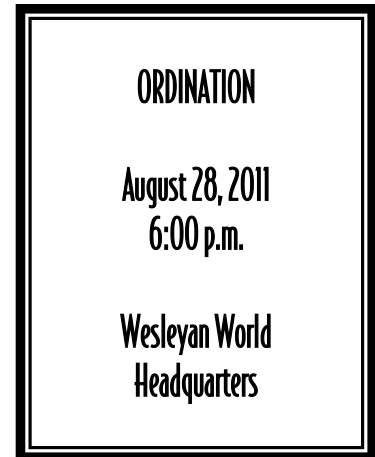

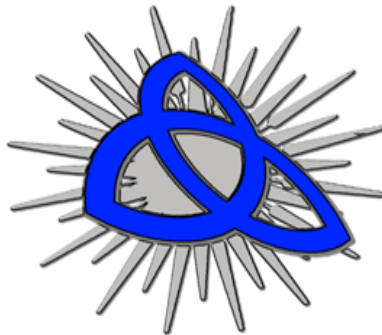

The Kids' Camp Director shall appoint a committee, ratified by the District Spiritual Formation Leadership Team, to help in the planning of Kids' Camp.**

Also, Wesleyan pastors will soon have an opportunity to audit classes at Wesley Seminary. The audited classes will be an affordable and accessible way for pastors to become lifelong learners and will be offered online or in a one-week intensive class on campus. Auditing classes provides an opportunity for pastors to investigate learning in a seminary environment before officially enrolling in a program leading to a degree. HISPANIC MINISTRIES

Ministries among Hispanics in Indiana Central District (ICD) continue to grow and develop, thanks to our Lord's help, strategic support by our district and sister local churches and the faithfulness of a growing group of Hispanic leaders under the coordination of Rev. Calimerio Rodríguez, Chairman of the Hispanic Zone.

Spanish-speaking Ministries. Four Hispanic churches continue to grow and develop in their Spanish-speaking ministries, as follows: Iglesia Wesleyana Templo de Poder (Frankfort), Iglesia Wesleyana Amistad Cristiana (Carmel), Iglesia Wesleyana Monte de Sion (West Indianapolis) and Iglesia Wesleyana Casa del Alfarero (Richmond). In recent months, these churches have also initiated Spanish-speaking ministries in other communities, including outreach from Richmond to Union City and from Carmel to downtown Indianapolis. In addition, several English-speaking churches also are now ministering in Spanish, including Anderson and Cicero. Furthermore, for several months Rev. Calimerio Rodríguez and his leadership team provided strategic support to Hispanic ministries in Indiana North District (Logansport).

District-wide Hispanic Activities. Under the leadership of Rev. Calimerio Rodríguez and our other Hispanic pastors, a wide range of activities have been carried out. Our pastors have met each month for sharing and discussion, planning and fellowship. Various special services in our local Hispanic churches were supported by their sister Hispanic congregations. An average of twenty-two students participated in the FLAME course "Pastoral Ministries" on Saturday afternoons each month in November, December, January, March, April and May. Rev. Altagracia López provided excellent leadership as Coordinator of our FLAME program in ICD. In addition, we participated in two workshops on immigration that were offered during the year, one that was sponsored by The Wesleyan Church Headquarters and another by a sister, local Hispanic church in downtown Indianapolis. Rev. Alfredo Barreno, National Director of Hispanic Ministries, has provided key support and encouragement and we are fortunate and grateful that he is now an active participant in our district Hispanic activities.

The Immigration Problem. All our Hispanic churches are ministering to the sizeable population of undocumented Hispanics in their communities. In addition, several of our pastors are still facing issues regarding their VISAs to continue to serve in ministry in our country. Your prayers on their behalf would be greatly appreciated. While we do not have simple answers to the immigration problem, we thank God for the opportunity to minister to Hispanic peoples in our state whose hearts are open to the Good News of Salvation.

Hispanic Ministries and Diversity. All our Hispanic churches are coming to realize that our future must involve a growing emphasis on cultural, ethnic and linguistic diversity. This kind of diversity is already a growing reality in our local Hispanic churches. Our children and youth are increasingly multicultural and multilingual, reflecting the growing ethnic, cultural and linguistic diversity of our nation. In addition, several of our Hispanic churches are attracting peoples of other ethnic and cultural backgrounds. It is encouraging to see new ministries emerge in our ICD churches among African Americans, Haitians, Asians and other ethnic and cultural groups. We look forward to working in close partnerships with our sister churches in ICD to reach peoples of all cultural, ethnic and linguistic backgrounds for our Lord and His coming Kingdom.

STEWARDSHIP OUTREACH STRATEGIES

To be stewards of the Good News of the Kingdom of God, we as a Church, must see our role as holistic in nature. John Wesley stated that, “there is no holiness but social holiness.” To implement such a social mission, not only is it important to raise the financial resources needed to facilitate the expansion of that mission into all of the needy places in our communities, but it becomes paramount that we steward our outreach strategies by structurally providing the framework to facilitate this mission of social holiness to our communities.

Toward that end, we are providing a strategic coordinated effort, through resourcing and training of our leadership on the local and district levels. As we step up our missional stewardship efforts, we are partnering with Rev. Jeremy Summers, who is providing oversight on the denominational level for Community Based Outreach Ministries. We look forward to continuing our work with Jeremy, as we strategize about how to respond to the need for compassionate ministries in our urban, suburban and rural communities.

Stewardship Outreach Strategies has provided a vehicle to facilitate social holiness in our communities this past year. Our task has been threefold: 1.) Stewardship Outreach Development, 2.) Encouraging & Empowerment of Developing and Cross-Cultural Churches, and 3.) Financial Stewardship Strategies. Our Urban Initiative Task Force and Compassionate Ministries Strategy Committee have met jointly on several occasions. Our key role has been to initiate and facilitate a Community Based Outreach Strategy across the district. We have assisted local churches in assessing and discovering the needs in their communities and continuing to strategize about ways we can resource and train these pastors and churches in meeting those needs.

The following are a few examples of our Resourcing and Training Strategies this past year:

- The Indiana Central District provided Operation Backpack, which provided over 1000 school supply items and 106 backpacks. These items were provided by a college and several churches in the Indianapolis area. School supplies were also provided to 130 children by another Indianapolis area Wesleyan church. A Muncie church also collected and distributed backpacks.
- Another district-wide event was a Community Health Fair which was hosted by the Indianapolis Calvary Family Wesleyan Church. Several District volunteers assisted on that day. There were health care vendors from various health care organizations, sharing information on various health care topics. This was truly a successful partnership between district and local church in resourcing for compassionate/community based ministries.
- We also sponsored a Wesleyan Urban Pastor’s Symposium at our Indianapolis Bethany Church. It was a great time of networking and resourcing for our urban ministries. We will have similar Community Based Outreach Symposiums in each region of the district—including Muncie, Anderson, Lafayette and the Noblesville/Fishers/Carmel area.

This stewardship strategy is not in isolation to the other ministries of The Wesleyan Church, but in fact is foundational to our denominational mission. We utilize “stewardship” as the driving force behind our strategies, because we see in I Peter 4:10 (NASB) *“As each one has received a special gift, employ it in serving one another as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.”* As good stewards of God’s grace, we proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom of God, as we partner together in all of our missional efforts to proclaim social holiness to our communities, whether they be in our large cities or rural communities.

SUMMARY OF PROJECT

HOPE seeks to provide educational assistance to pastors and churches for overcoming financial issues, thereby strengthening the quality of ministry in the district. Additionally, HOPE makes available some matching funds for pastors to help alleviate financial pressures. A brochure is available that more fully explains the project. I have a few copies with me at today's conference. You may also email me at mrennswc@sbcglobal.net and I can send the brochure as an attached file.

KEY ACTIVITIES

- During last year's district conference, the first wave of grants was distributed through the project. Grants totaled over \$21,000 and were distributed to ICD churches.
- The second wave of grants will be distributed during the conference today.
- Two educational opportunities were provided, including distribution of Dan Busby's Church Reporting Procedures to all ICD churches. We also conducted the 2nd Optimal Stewardship Summit on March 5. Over 708 laity and pastors from ICD participated in the three-hour event. Kevin Batman, General Treasurer of The Wesleyan Church, was the keynote speaker, presenting some best practices for local church policies and procedures. A binder containing several church policy/procedure resources was also distributed during the event. Copies of the resources were subsequently mailed to all churches that did not participate in the event.
- Program and financial reports were provided to Lilly Endowment, Inc. at the close of the calendar year in accordance with Lilly's reporting requirements. The reports were approved by Lilly.
- I attended three all-day project director meetings with Lilly Endowment representatives and project directors from other denominations engaged in similar initiatives. Three HOPE committee members attended an all-day session at IUPUI in November.
